Neighborhood Based Service Delivery

The Drake Neighborhood is one of ten Des Moines neighborhoods that participate in the City's Neighborhood Based Service Delivery Program (NBSD). The program incorporates assets from all city departments in an effort to enhance the quality of services to the designated neighborhoods.

Individuals from several City departments - Police Department, Fire Department, Parks and Recreation, Water Works, Public Works and Housing/Health & Zoning – work together as teams to assist the neighborhood in identifying and prioritizing concerns, planning a course of action and implementing a solution.

The NBSD team members most visible in the neighborhood are those from the Police Department and Housing/Health & Zoning. These team members are assigned SUVs or pickups with a distinctive blue and gold striping package and decals designating them as part of the Neighborhood Enforcement Team. The Neighborhood Enforcement Team members are on the street and available most weekdays between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Please contact them if you have a crime-, zoning- or housing-related problem in your neighborhood. BUT, remember: In the event of a crime-related emergency ALWAYS first call 911!
