## **Neighborhood Based Service Delivery**

If you didn't know, The Drake Neighborhood is one of ten Des Moines neighborhoods that participate in the City's Neighborhood Based Service Delivery Program (NBSD). The program incorporates assets from all city departments in an effort to enhance the quality of services to the designated neighborhoods. Individuals from several City departments and a member of the neighborhood work together as teams with the objective of assisting the neighborhood in identifying and prioritizing concerns, planning a course of action and implementing a solution to the problem. The NBSD team members most visible in the neighborhood are those from the Police Department and Housing/Health & Zoning. In addition to attending neighborhood meetings, the Neighborhood Enforcement Team members are on the street and available most weekdays between 8:00 am – 8:00 pm. Make sure to contact them if you have a crime, suspicion, zoning or housing related problem in your neighborhood. If you don't contact them, they may not know that there is a problem. E-mail is usually the best way to notify our NBSD team of the issue, but feel free to call also. The neighborhood itself is an important part of the NBSD team approach to solving neighborhood problems. Please remember to include the DNA Crime and Safety Committee when notifying NBSD team members. Its e-mail address is nbsd@drakeneighborhood.org. Once you notify our team, the issue has a much better chance of being rectified. If we work together as neighbors and help our team out, everybody wins.


