It dies completely back and in early to mid August you will be surprised to find a tall stem with pink blooms in your garden (or messy garage.)

St. Catherine's is a Well-Kept Secret

Built on the corner of 28th and University in 1997, St. Catherine's of Siena serves Drake University students, Drake Neighborhood residents and people from all over the Des Moines metro.

Before the building was constructed, students met at various locations on the Drake campus. Funding for the Catholic Church and Student Center was spearheaded by Drake University and the building is located on property owned by Drake University. While the University owns the property, they do not own the building, which makes it a true partnership. "It's a great relationship," said Sara Foster, office manager. Fr. Mark Owusu is Pastor at St. Kate's, as it is affectionately referred to.

St. Catherine's is a recognized student organization and a home away from home for students. A leadership team is elected and a service project planned each year. Fellowship socials and student dinners are held, in addition to classes, lectures and conferences. They have also been extremely generous to let the Drake Neighborhood Association use their facilities for monthly board meetings.

While the core and focus of St. Catherine's are the Drake students, the congregation also includes around 130 families, mainly from the Drake Neighborhood. "Most people don't know we serve others in addition to the students," said Foster. This non-student faith community enjoys social outings such as I-Cubs games, Drake Relays festivities and football games. Outside speakers are brought in, lectures held and an annual healthcare conference is hosted at St. Kate's. Several times each year the student center holds concerts with choirs and local bands. These events are free and open to the public.
