The record of her graduates before the State Board of Medical Examiners is the highest.

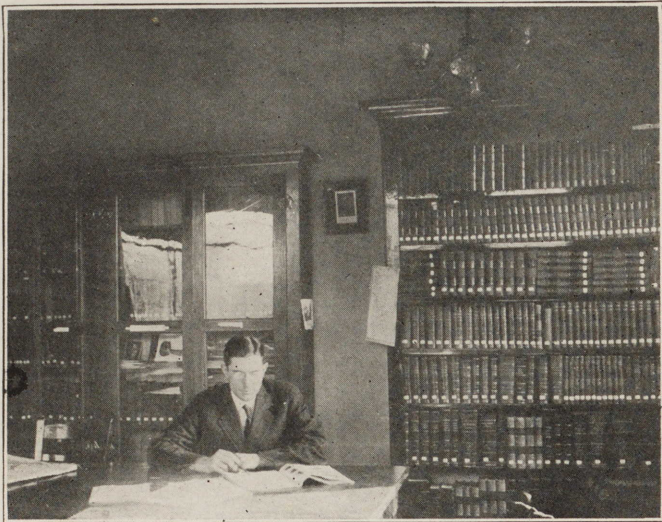
Is classed by the New York Board of Medical Examiners in Group I, Class I, entitling her graduates to admission to licensing examination.

The eye and ear clinic is considered the best in the west.

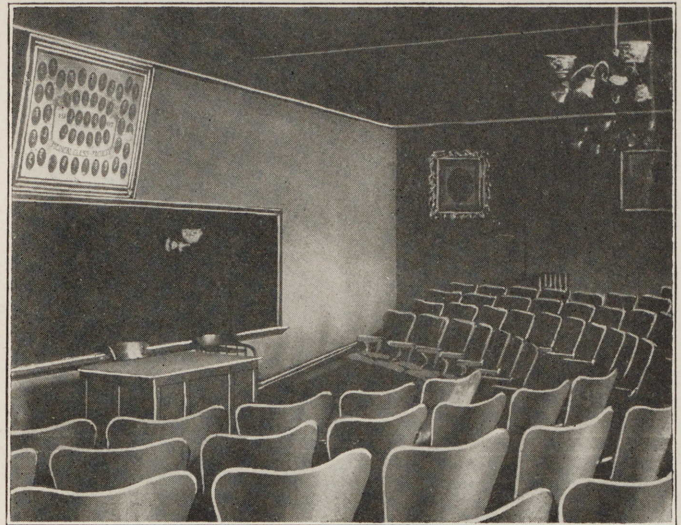
The combined course of seven years is exceedingly attractive to high school graduates.

Des Moines, as a location for a medical college, is not equalled by any other city in the State of Iowa.



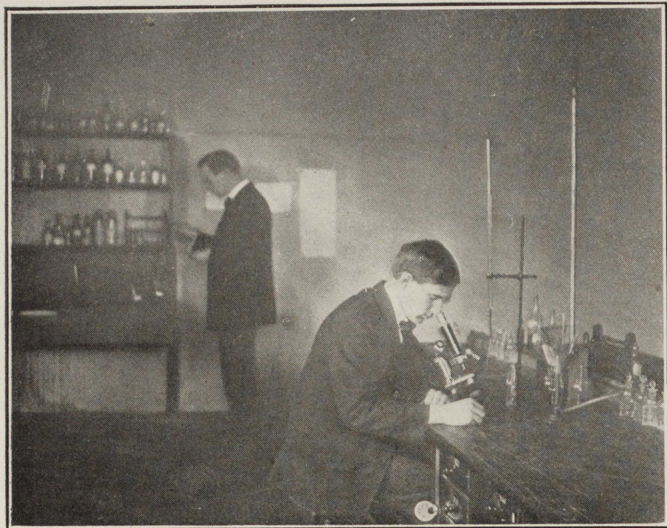
In the Library, Senior Medical Building.

For purposes of ready reference there is a card index of all books and periodicals. Indexed by title and by author.



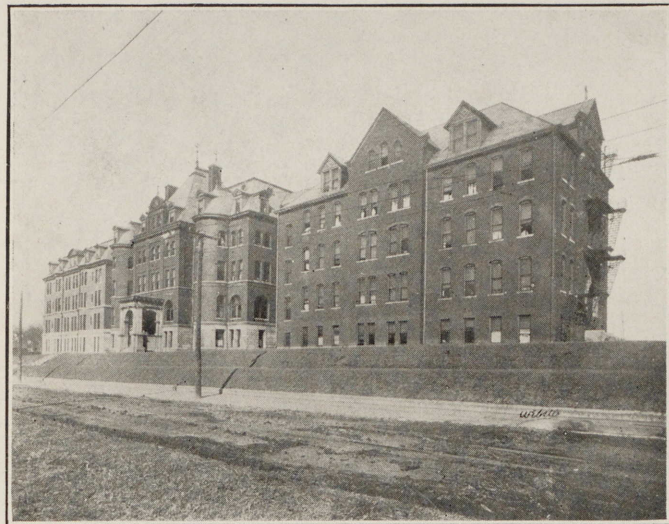
The Auditorium, Shown in Part.

Here all classes may meet together on special occasions.



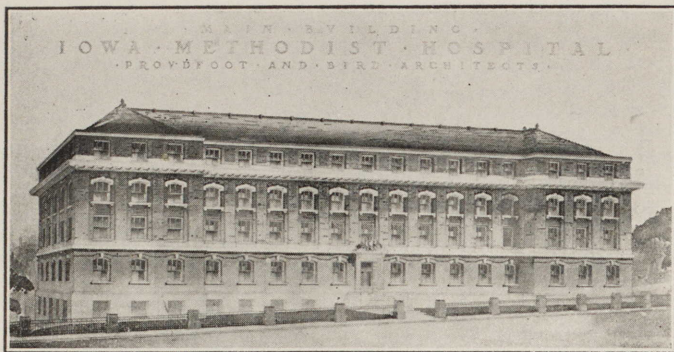
The Laboratory of Clinical Pathology.

Methodist Hospital—West Wing.



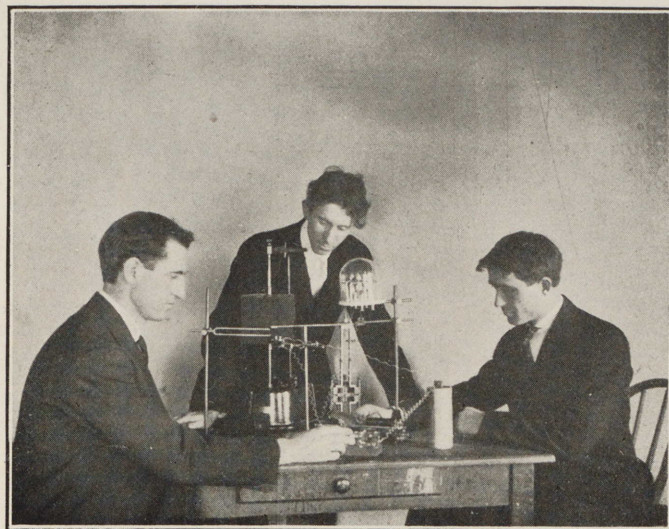
Salvation Army Rescue Home.

New wing added, increases capacity greatly. Obstetrical work given here under charge of Dr. Meanes,



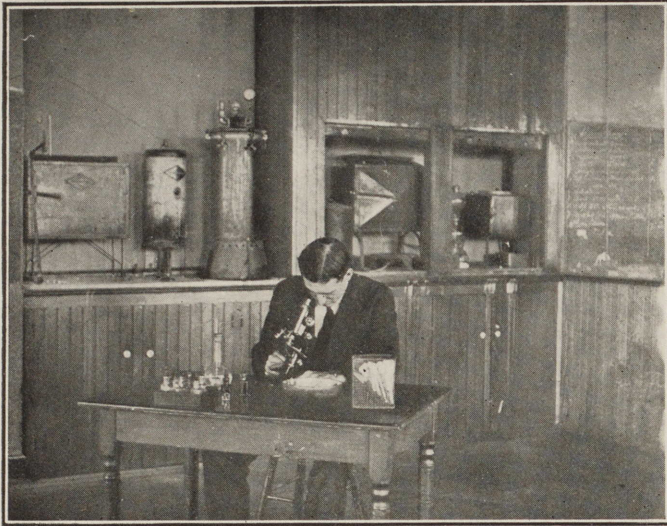
Science Hall.

Fifty students work here.



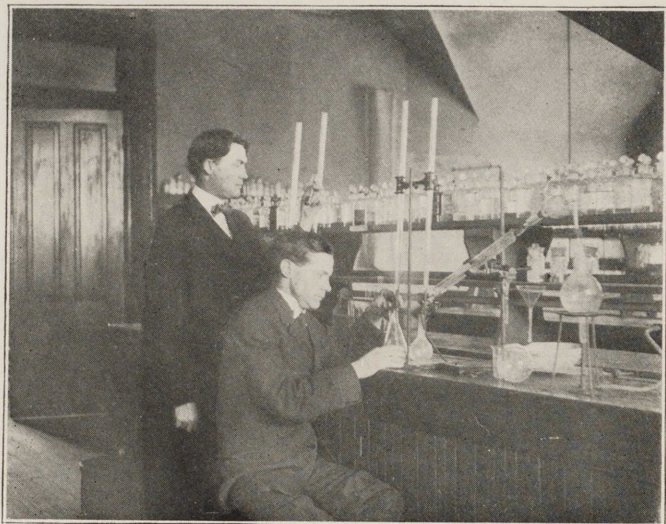
A Corner in the Bacteriological Laboratory.

Accommodates forty-five students. Iowa State Board of Health Auxiliary Laboratory is located here.



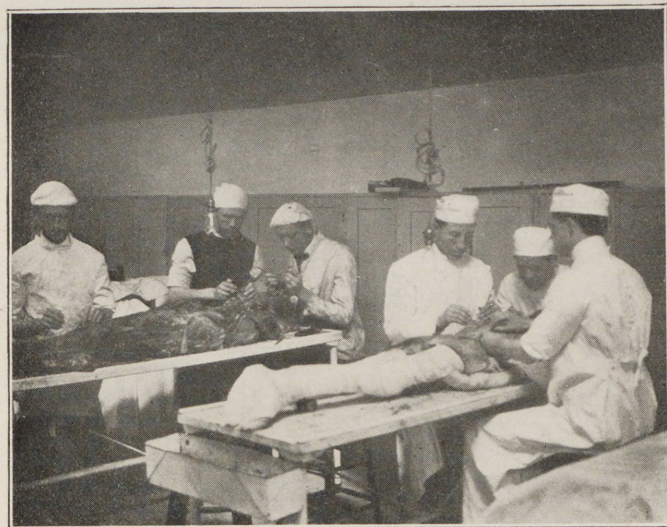
In the First Year Medical Chemistry Laboratory.

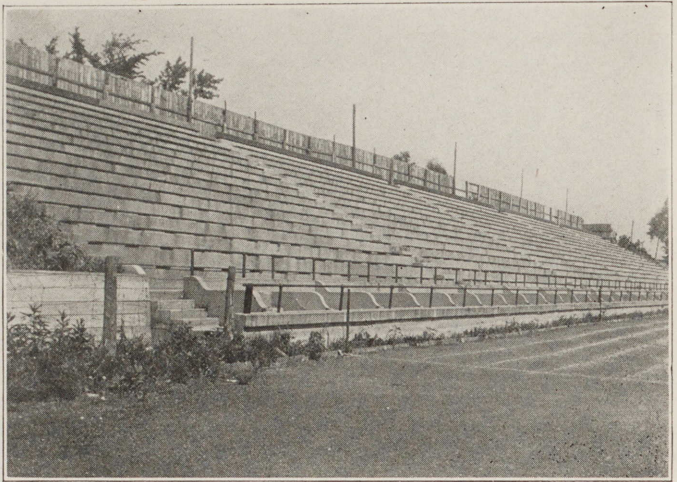
