Bust of Dr. Medbury to Be Presented to Drale

Will Be Gift Of '07 Class

Pastor Died in Pulpit Last Year.

A bronze bust of the late Dr. Charles S. Medbury will be presented to Drake university at 10 a. m. Thursday.

The bust, the work of Miss Florence Sprague, Drake professor of art, will be given by the class of 1907 and will be presented during the morning chapel service.

Dr. Medbury, formerly pastor of University Church of Christ and known as "dean of Des Moines ministers," was stricken in his pulpit Sunday, Apr. 24, 1932, just after completing his sermon and died before he could be taken from the church. Heart disease caused his death.

"My Class."

In addition to reasons of personal friendship and gratitude which are associated with the gift, the 1907 class is presenting the memorial because Dr. Medbury first took up his pastorate here when the class was just entering the university.

Dr. Medbury often had referred to the 1907 class as "my class" and always counted himself among "those freshmen of 1907."

In addition to his prominence in the Christian church organization, Dr. Medbury also was known for his connections with the university. He preached nearly every fall convocation until his death.

Choir to Sing.

The presentation Thursday will be by Fred W. Swanson as class representative. Several members of the class who still reside in Des Moines will attend. The chapel choir, under the direction of Stanford Hulshizer, assisted by a mixed quartet, will sing.

The bronze bust will have a permanent place on the east side of the chapel rostrum.
