June- 14- 1911 3 15 A.M.

And I have to roll out at 6 o'clock. Many things were predicted in the letters read tonight which were placed in the jug four years ago that at that time seemed rather visionary. The University has made wonderful growth- I believe a more wonderful growth will be witnessed within the next four years. Drake is surely destined to become one of the <u>great</u> schools of the middle West. We are proud of our relationship now- we will be more proud five years hence. The problem of raising \$400,000 is great but will probably be ordinary compared to problems of today. (Back Side)

We as a class have received a great deal of fame and many words of praise for maintaining such a well organized class- in as much as we have- our responsibility to the University as a class is increased in projection. We have made a great record, and we can maintain our lead and keep on setting (written twice) precedents for all classes before us and all classes coming after us, to follow-
