Updates

- 1. Marcia Keyser is this year's chair of the University Curriculum Committee. Among other things this year, they will be tackling a re-review of all values and ethics AOI courses.
- 2. Catherine Gillespie will be representing Drake SOE at the University of KwaZulu Natal in Durban, South Africa from September 26-October 5. She will be working on making faculty research collaborations and checking out opportunites for student exchanges.
- 3. The State Board of Education met yesterday to approve revisions in Chapter 79, which will affect accreditation requirements for all licensure areas (teaching, counseling, and leadership). Stay tuned for details.

Spotlight

Senator Tom Harkin has announced that Drake University will receive a U.S. Department of Education Office of Special Education and Rehabilitation Services grant for Rehabilitation Counseling and Long Term Training. This grant is funded at approximately \$200,000 per year for an anticipated five years, totaling nearly \$1,000,000! Drake University will use this funding for long-term training funds to provide a Masters of Science degree in Rehabilitation Counseling with an emphasis in employer development. Of the total amount, Drake will use \$150,000 (75%) each year to fund student stipends. This amount will allow the Drake School of Education to assist an average of 15-16 students per year. This average is based upon an anticipated mix of full-time and part-time students.

As Project Director, Dr. Robert Stensrud will administer the grant and teach courses that are part of the required curriculum. Dr. Matt Bruinekool will also devote his time assisting with the management of the grant and teaching a grant-specific course.

This project will have a national impact by partnering with the Council of State Administrators of Vocational Rehabilitation to create and support a national clearinghouse for Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) to create and support a national clearinghouse for VR agencies that will match students with open Internships, graduate with open jobs, Rehabilitation Services Administration scholars with mentors, and bring national speakers into classrooms via distance education technology. This service and the degree program will be sustained after project completion so VR professionals can receive Continuing Education Units for their assistance in student supervision, mentoring, onboarding, and guest speaking to classes.

Gov. Terry Branstad, First Lady Chris Branstad and Lt. Gov. Kim Reynolds launch bullying prevention listening tour

Branstad-Reynolds Administration continues commitment to better address bullying in schools

(DES MOINES) – Gov. Terry Branstad, First Lady Chris Branstad and Lt. Gov. Kim Reynolds announced they will visit three Iowa school districts this fall to learn more about what Iowa schools are doing to deal with bullying and what steps Iowans would like the state to take next.

Better addressing the problem of bullying in schools has been a top priority of the Branstad-Reynolds Administration. Their work has included two statewide bullying prevention summits in Des Moines, which each drew an audience of more than 1,000, including many students from across the state. They've also proposed legislation to give schools clear discretion to respond to cyberbullying that occurs away from school but seriously interferes with a student's education at school, as well as requiring parents to be notified if their child is the target of bullying....

Branstad, Reynolds, Education Director Buck unveil Financial Literacy Work Team recommendations

Buck convened the 13-member work team in January of 2014 to ensure Iowa students are learning the financial literacy skills needed for success.
