## Appeal from two 22 year old SOE graduates

Our names are Mary Stang and Anna Suminski and we are recent SOE graduates from the undergraduate initial teacher licensure program in elementary education. We're just about to embark on a year-long adventure to improve education in Ghana in a village called Asikuma. When sharing this decision with people, many people have asked us what exactly we will be doing.

While in Asikuma we will be working for Kingdom Cares International, a non-profit organization that works sustainably in Ghana to improve the lives of many through education, community outreach, and the development of transferable skills. The primary focus of our work will be to help develop the primary school that Kingdom Cares opened earlier this year. Our goal is to create a curriculum for children that allows them to learn everything necessary to pass the high school entrance exam that is necessary for them to further their education. We will be working very closely with a team of teachers there to ensure that the students are being taught effectively, and that the school is running smoothly.

We are going to be working in a school and community that has a lot of expected and unexpected needs. Our goal is to raise significant funds to help cover the needs of the school and students. Some possible uses for the funds include feeding 200 school children on a daily basis (\$200 per day), student uniforms (\$13-14), teacher salaries (\$100 per month per teacher), student transportation (\$150 per week), and educational materials.
