We're writing to encourage you to provide feedback this spring on the state's literacy standards for students in kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

The Iowa Department of Education has announced two public forums on April 25-26 and a statewide survey to gather feedback from Iowans on the current literacy standards, which outline learning expectations for English-language arts and for literacy in history, social studies, science, and other technical subjects.

This public input process is part of a review of the literacy standards that was prompted by the Governor's Executive Order 83.
