Dear Graduate & Professional Degree Seeking Student, Drake University strives to create a respectful, safe, and non-threatening environment where its members are able to live, study, and work free from sexual and interpersonal misconduct. In keeping with this goal, Drake is requiring all incoming graduate and professional students (spring '16, summer '16, and fall '16) to complete the online Prevention & Intervention course pertaining to sexual and interpersonal misconduct by Saturday, October 15, 2016 so that you are aware of the policies, resources, and support available on and off campus. You have received this email because you have been identified as a student who entered Drake in one of these three terms. This course will take between 15-20 minutes to complete and must be completed in one sitting. This effort is consistent with our obligations under Title IX as well as the Violence Against Women Act. Students want to live and learn within a campus community that is safe and respectful, so keeping Drake a safe space is a responsibility we all share.

Please note that if you were an undergraduate student at Drake last fall and completed the undergraduate module, *Haven*, you will still need to complete this course. To prevent a hold from being placed on your account (i.e., a hold will prevent you from being able to register for the spring term until this module has been completed), you will need to complete this course before the October 15th deadline.
