## 10 facts you may not know about lowa schools

Each year, Iowa surveys its schools and releases key findings in the annual Condition of Education report, which is produced by the Iowa Department of Education. Here are 10 key facts from the 2016 report, which compiles information from the most recent years available:

- 1. **483,451 students** enrolled in public schools in 2015-16. After a 17-year decline, it marks the fifth year that public school enrollment increased.
- 2. **33,040 students** attend non-public schools, such as private or religious schools. Their enrollment has grown for the past three years.
- 3. **22.6 percent** of lowa students were of minority racial or ethnic descent in 2014-15. The year before, it was 21.8 percent.
- 4. **\$56,449** is the average total salary that teachers earned in the 2014-15 school year, an increase of 2 percent over the vear before.
- 5. **\$142,127** is the average total salary of superintendents in 2014-15, up 2.6 percent from the previous year.
- 6. **19.9** is the average size of kindergarten classes in Iowa, well above the state goal of 17 students or fewer. Iowa has not met its classroom size goal during the last 15 years. However, the average kindergarten class size is down from 20.3 in 2013.
- 7. **76 percent** of fourth-graders are reading at grade level, which held steady from 2013. In math, 79.2 percent are on grade level, down slightly from 79.5 percent in 2013, according to lowa Testing Programs.
- **8. 22.1 points** is the average ACT composite score for Iowa students, above the national average of 20.8. The test includes English, math, reading and science reasoning, and has a possible 36 points. Roughly 68 percent of Iowa students took the exam, but in Des Moines Public Schools, nearly 100 percent of students participated.
- **9. 90.8 percent** of students in the class of 2015 graduated high school, the highest graduation rate nationally. Roughly half of states require students to take pass an exit exam before
