Midterm grade push

New University Policy: All undergraduates should be given midterm grades in MYDUSIS (open between September 11 and October 23). This will be monitored by the Office of the Registrar, and enforced by Dean's offices. Grades can be migrated from Blackboard for efficiency, or entered into MYDUSIS by hand. Giving midterm grades helps to retain students overall, and helps students who are not doing well to have enough information to make the decision about whether or not to drop with a W before the deadline (which is October 25). Undergraduate students who are not athletes can drop below 12 credits and still maintain full-time status (because a W is considered a letter grade).
