Drake Relays Parking --

All parking regulations are in effect during the Drake Relays until 9 am to allow for faculty, students, and staff with valid permits to park. After 9 am lots are open to visitors. For the two large University Admissions events in the Fall and Spring as well as the University Job Fair in the Spring, Zone 1 may be closed. If Zone 1 is closed permit holders are allowed to park in any other Zone except for Zone 2 and 3. Announcements about this will be made in OnCampus.

Visitor Designated Parking Starting August 1 --

Starting August 1 when the parking zone changes go into effect, the designated visitor's parking will be located in lot 1A at the Dial Center or lot 20 – Aliber West for the campus.

Completing 8-hour requirement for 2019 during May?

May is a great time for faculty to complete some of their 8-hour requirement after things calm down at Drake and while schools are still in session.

As a reminder, each full and part-time faculty member teaching a class that is required for Iowa BOEE licensure (including part-timers/adjuncts) are required to complete 8 hours of (1) co-teaching in a PK-12 classroom every year for people in the Teaching and Learning Department or (2) meaningful interaction that would parallel the experiences of the position for which you are preparing students in the Leadership and Counseling department.

To clarify **for Teacher Education**: Every faculty member in teacher education must co-teach for 8 hours during 2019 and report the hou4w using the link above. If that faculty member is a current teacher, they can use the link to indicate they are working full or part time as a teacher (or their faculty liaison/mentor can do it for them).

To clarify **for Leadership and School Counseling**: Every faculty member who prepares principals, superintendents, or school counselors – for all classes listed on the approved BOEE Exhibit Sheets – must interact meaningfully during 2019 in ways that a principal, superintendent, or school counselor (as appropriate) might do as part of their job. If that faculty member is a current principal, superintendent, or school counselor, they can use the link to indicate they are currently working full or part time in their profession (or their faculty liaison/mentor can do it for them).
